Greetings Niagara County Pro-Am Participants,

It appears Spring has finally arrived! It's time to gear up for the 33<sup>rd</sup> Annual Lake Ontario Pro-Am Salmon Team Tournament May 19-21 out of Wilson and Olcott. The website at <a href="https://www.lakeontarioproam.net">www.lakeontarioproam.net</a> is now live for accepting registrations!! Register today!!

In case you haven't heard, I have accepted the Director position for the Niagara Tournament. As you know, I hold this tournament close to my heart - as it is named after my father (Skip Hartman). Going forward I will commit to you that I will do what is in the best interest of this tournament and participants. All I ask of you is to please support me during this transition period. Moving forward, all questions and concerns can be directed to me via phone or email. I look forward to working with each of you.

The Pro Division will be going back to the Classic 12 fish limit. I have heard from numerous participants who would like this tournament to be held the first week in June and I have committed to June 2, 3 and 4th in 2018. In the Amateur Open, the three single day events have become very popular. Again, 100 percent payback for the top four teams each day and a \$500 Cup Prize for the team with the best two-day score. Spread the word!

We are again working very hard on sponsorships and new sponsors. I can thank Dr. John Syracuse for once again going to the Niagara County Legislature and asking for the generous monies that we have been able to obtain in the past. We have also received support from the Town of Newfane and Destination Niagara USA. New sponsors are Keller Technologies and Raymarine. Signing on once again were Fish USA, ITO Flies, Dreamweaver, Lake Ontario Outdoors, NY Outdoor News, A-Tom-Mik Flies, Lake Ontario United, and several local businesses that help pull it all together. We appreciate all your support in 2017. We will proudly offer a pay back above and beyond the entry fee purse (100 percent) with a minimum of \$10,000. The Destination Niagara USA offices will be looking at numbers of participating teams this year and gauge their support moving forward based on that.

An effort is underway to elevate the Lake Ontario Challenge Cup once again – including Niagara, Oswego and Wayne counties for a combined score. As of right now, we have \$1,500 in the pot for the winning team, but if we can double that, we can pay the top three teams based on \$1,500, \$1,000 and \$500. # MATEUR OPENER PROMIS

#### Niagara's Pro-Am brings Am Division back!

The Niagara Pro Am made a number of changes to the 2016 Tournament based upon feedback it has received on the best way to grow the participation in this event. Specifically, on the Amateur side, the best features from the existing Recreational Open and from the previous Amateur Division have been merged together to create the new Amateur Division for 2017. These features include:

All participants will be truly Amateurs, no US Coast Guard licensed Captains will be allowed on any teams;

All NYS waters on Lake Ontario are open to fishing;

No Observers will be required;

The dates have been moved to when the fishing is normally near shore and excellent off of the Niagara County shoreline. This should make the competition more enjoyable and will level the "Trolling Field" so that everyone has a shot at winning;

You can start whenever you want, wherever you want (Niagara County ports only), but you must be in line by 2:30 pm each day to weigh in at Krull Park in Olcott (Lions Club Pavilion, North). To help level the playing field, you must launch out of any of four Niagara County ports – from Fort Niagara to Golden Hill.

Any combination of your top three Salmon or Trout (only 1 may be a Lake Trout) will be your "box" to be weighed;

Online registration is available as late as the Monday before the event (May 15);

Entry fees are very reasonable with payouts more than 100 percent of the entry fees plus merchandise prizes. Big fish prizes, too, each day. The intent is to pay back the top four teams each day based on 40-30-20-10 percentage breakdowns and big fish overall.

Each of the three days is a separate event. You can choose to fish any of the days that best fit your schedule.

If you choose two or three days, then your two best scores will automatically enter you into the competition for the West End Amateur Cup and a check for \$500 in Cash.

#### TEAM THRILLSEEKER 2016 CHALLENGE CUP CHAMPS



Last season, the Lake Ontario Pro-Am formatted tournaments joined together to bring back the history, tradition and intense competition of the "Lake Ontario Challenge Cup." This prestigious cup is awarded to the tournament team that displays consistency throughout the three Pro-Am "classic format" events, held at different times in different locations.

This unique competition challenge will once again be available to Captains and teams fishing all three of these style events in Niagara, Oswego and Wayne counties in 2017. Highest point totals accumulated in the three contests combined will earn the Challenge Cup and the prize associated with it. Each of the tournaments (Niagara, Oswego and Wayne/Sodus) will be contributing \$500 to the Cup payout. Teams must sign up for the Challenge Cup competition by the Captain's meeting at the Niagara Tournament, located at the Wilson Fire Hall at 6 p.m. on May 18. The collector of the monies will be Matt LeClair, organizer of the Wayne County Tournament and the final stop on the Pro-Am Series trail. Scoring is simply based on your tournament scores for each event.

Last year (2016), the Challenge Cup winner was once again Team Thrillseeker led by Capt. Vince Pierleoni of Newfane. It was his first Cup win in a decade, previously registering cups in 1995, 1998, 2000, 2003, 2005 and 2006. A new travelling cup trophy has been started and will be passed along from year to year.



At the end of the first day and eight hours of fishing, only three 12-fish limits came to the scales. In the pro division, Yankee Troller connected with the first punch and topped the classic division with a limit catch of 12 Fish and an impressive score of 271.49 points based on 10 points per fish and a point per pound! However, second place was Shark Tank with a score of 221.76 points with only 10 Fish. Yankee Troller won the \$1,000 big box for the Classic Division for the day. In the Trophy Class for best 5 fish, it was Shark Tank edging Yankee Troller 139.06 to 138.23. They traded punches and it seemed like it was a draw. But with two more days to go, it was still anyone's fight.

work cut out for them.

On Day 2 in the trophy and classic divisions, Shark Tank won the round hands down. The team was a model of consistency as they won big box in both divisions, earning an extra \$1,500 in doing so. The Trophy Score was 132.93 points, just over six points away from day one. The team's Classic score of 219.66 points was only two points different from the day before. That said, the eye on the prize was the three day win and the Niagara Cup, but it wasn't going to be easy. Fishing was a bit tougher as no limits came to the scales among the pros. However, Shark

Tank did have 11 fish, a better number than the first day for them.


On Day 3, the first-ever three day Niagara USA Pro Am Tournament, Yankee Troller fought their way back big time. Their first "hook" was a 5-fish Trophy Score of 133.13 to give them a three day total of 350.73 points. With 11 fish in the box, the team's Classic score was 238.30 points for the day, giving them a total score of 589.16 points and the lead for the contest. Shark Tank needed a score of at least 80 in the Trophy Division and 150 in the Classic to recapture the lead and take the win. As they approached the scales, the official observer's log showed off eight fish. Would it be enough? It was! The Oswego team score 119 in the Trophy and 158 in the Classic to take both titles.

Shark Tank set the pace in both the five fish Trophy class (391.15 points) and the 12 fish Classic Division (599.45) and earned the Niagara Cup in both - winning over \$29,000 in the process. They also won the ITO Flies big fish for the tournament with a 23.96 pound king salmon. Runner up in both divisions was Yankee Troller and it was a fight to the finish. They won over \$8,000. Third place in Trophy was Dirty Goose led by Capt. Casey Prisco with 341.21 points. Fourth place was Team Thrillseeker led by Capt. Vince Pierleoni of Newfane with 338.05. Third place Classic team was Team Thrill-

seeker with 505.72 points. Fourth place was Free Spirit with 498.47 points led by Capt. Paul Czarnecki of Waterford, PA.

In the Amateur Open, Fishin' Physician Assistant led by Abe Debadts of Rochester scored a three fish total of 88.49 points to win the day. He also had big fish for the Open at 23.90 pounds, a king salmon. The team won more than \$1,500 in cash and product. Day 2 winner was Fisherman's Daughter led by Greg Wiacek of North Tonawanda with a score of 72.52 points. He nipped Anonymous led by John Muehl of Maryland, NY with 72.47 points. Anonymous had big fish for the day with 19.89 pounds. In the Amateur Open for Day Three, it was Mean Machine and Kyle Hovak of North Tonawanda taking the day with a 3 fish limit score of 80.10 points. They also had big fish, a 23.12 pound king salmon. However it wasn't enough to win the Amateur Open Cup for the best two days of team totals combined. That was reserved for Anonymous led by Muehl. He placed second on Day 3 with a score of 78.46 points and also placed second on Day 2 with a score of 72.47 points. A total of 28 teams competed in the Amateur Open Division.



Fat Nancy's annual Big Fish Friday saw continued good weather and nice Kings. Team Praying Mantis took 1st place with 59.10 pounds on 3 fish followed by A-Tom-Mik/CB11 and Marina Mechanic in third.

The main event started Saturday morning and the weather gods were still shining on us! Calm sunny weather saw tourney boats head out in all directions.

Day 1 in the Pro division saw Team Oh Baby, Capt. Matt LeClair make a very long run payoff taking the Day 1 lead with 208.85 points followed by ThrillSeeker, Capt. Vince Pierleoni of Newfane with 168.55; Double Treble, Capt. Mike Lewis, with 166.60; PrimeTime, Capt. Pete LaHosky, 159.00; Cold Steel, Capt. Tom Burke 138.80. The Amateur division saw Team Trouble Shooter led by Greg Dale take the Day 1 lead with 88.15 points followed

The Amateur division saw Day 1 leader Trouble Shooter come in with the best catch of a short Day 2 as well and take the win by a good margin with 148.75 points (good for \$2,400 plus prizes). Team Thinkin' Big, Rodney Brown came in 2nd with 97.40; My Time in 3rd 95.20; Second Nature, Eric King in 4th with 88.95; and Warship, Mike Nardone 5th with 78.85 points.

Day 2 Pro saw the same as the Amateur as Day 1 leader Oh Baby held onto 1st place with a score of 282.1 (good for \$6,600 plus prizes), followed by Cold Steel, 270.5; ThrillSeeker, 235.05; Double Treble, 207.80; Team A-Tom-Mik, 190.9 points.

We were happy to have over 60 teams competing between the 1KaDay, Big Fish Friday and the Pro and Amateur divisions of the Pro Am. We gave out over \$30,000 in cash & prizes with one team winning \$2400 by just sweeping Big fish Friday & the 1KaDay right before the main event! Hope to see everyone back this year!!



istorically, the Pro-Am teams fishing from Sodus Point experience hot weather. It's mid-July and that's a common occurrence with the summer solstice. No big deal when you're on Lake Ontario. True...it's a little inconvenient under the weigh-in tent, however not a big issue on the open water.

Wind, on the other hand becomes an issue. Over the years the competitors have endured some strong winds, not what would be described as a full gale.

The weather app on Internet said winds five to eight from the Northwest for Saturday, July16. From the pier heads of Sodus Bay it didn't appear to be calm winds; the chops were brutal and the swells were not small. Not really five to eight...more like 10 to 20 mph.

Just asked any of the 50 team members if they thought they were fishing in calm seas? "It was tough fishing, very choppy," was the common declaration from the teams for day one of the event.

Day two was calmer water and when the final team came to the weigh scales the "Shark Tank" team walked away with the first place trophy and \$7000.

Captain Greg Gehrig, and "Shark Tank" team members James Foltz and Erik Brockway didn't fare so well during the pre-fishing contest dubbed Captain Jack's Big Fish Friday. "We did terrible,"

Gehrig said during the awards ceremony on Sunday, July 17. "How about this. We were researching and didn't want to show our hand," he guipped.

Saturday, and the official start of the Pro-Am saw the team on top of their game, fishing west of Sodus Bay. "We were looking for brown trout, however that didn't work. We bailed on the browns and went north looking for colder temperatures. We marked the kings straight out from the Ginna Power Plant and never left the area. We were using Diabolical Custom Tackle Meat Rigs from Michigan and Shimano rods

The "Shark Tank" team, which fishes out of Oswego County, came back to port with ten salmon, a laker and a steelhead. They weighed a very impressive box of fish scoring 237.45. The Cold Steel team, another Oswego competitor, was leading on the first day with 262.95. Pro-Am scores are tabulated with ten points per fish and 10 points per pound.

Captain Greg Gehrig and team set out Sunday morning with a calmer Lake Ontario. "We went right back to the same location and caught 10 salmon and two lakers." The "Shark Tank" team hit the scales with a 223.95 bringing their two-day winning total to

The \$7000 purse will be used for the usual expenses associated with competitive sport fishing. That's what the captain said. Team member Foltz suggested buying twin 350 horse power outboards.

Only three and half pounds separated first from second place, a very finite weight when you are reeling in 25

pound kings. The "Thrillseeker" team, another winner on the tournament trail tallied 457.85 for their two-day score. "We trolled from Pultneyville to Nine Mile Point," Captain Vince Pierleoni said accepting his trophy and \$3,500 in cash. "On day two we fished out from the Ginna Power Plant and did the kings and steelhead.

his "Roll With It" team certainly rolled on the waters Saturday. Sabo and his four-man team fished east of Port Bay, one of the few boats that didn't head west. "I have a 27-foot Sea Ray Amberjack and it was a tough troll for us," Sabo said. The 28-year-old New Jersey resident fishes out of Sodus Bay during the summer. "I love the Sodus Pro-Am," he said.
